## NOTES

The rows of figures highlighted in yellow are the six countries and one overseas territory from which the Winter Fuel Payment has been removed, following the application of the so-called 'Temperature Test Policy'.

The row of figures highlighted in green are the figures for the Republic of Ireland.

The final column of figures shows the 'new' claimants recorded for the six countries and one overseas territory from which the WFP has been removed; and the Republic of Ireland 'new' claimants able to continue receiving the WFP.

The final two rows of figures show the predicted figures for 'new' claimants published by the DWP in July 2013, compared with the actual figures contained in the published statistics - note the figures highlighted in red.
